

Deanery Synod – finance

The job of the treasurer is to administer the accounts of the Deanery, collecting money in, managing it and spending it as authorised by Synod.

There are two sources of income – the Diocese and the Parishes.

The **Diocesan Grant** pays the administrative expenses of the Rural Dean.

The Deanery is given an amount of money from which the Rural Dean's expenses are paid: every quarter, an account is rendered to the Diocese who top up the money in the Deanery account to bring it back to the original amount.

The **parishes** pay an annual sum, currently (2017) £50 for each lay member they are entitled to elect to synod (synod should have 55 lay members from 16 parishes). The money is to be spent on such mission activities as Synod decides.
