
Young People?

Youth Ministry?


"I've seen massive cultural shifts in my lifetime, and I feel unequipped to start building some of these bridges, because I feel culturally generations are so, so far apart."

Few young people in church often means no critical mass for a group

Youth work is not prioritised or resourced

Breaking the cycle

Families / young people leave or don't join churches

Patchy, weak or non-existent youth provision



What does this mean?

- 1. There is an urgent need to focus on teenagers, as well as children
- 2. Context and culture has changed and so must our approach
- 3. Reversing the cycle means prioritising young people, and investing in support for churches



Presence - Places - Pathways

"It's all well and good setting something up, like a youth group, or whatever it is, but unless you think how that's going to disciple them, how it's going bring them on that path, if you just think of one event, or one thing, then it's going to die flat, but if you think big picture, 'How are we going to take them on this process of faith?'





"Our biggest challenge is having people with a heart and commitment to work with young people. Those who have this enthusiasm are already busy and cannot give the time required to build anything that lasts."






ENGAGEMENT WITH CHILDREN IN THE COMMUNITY




